
THE STORY OF Eventing at Rain

n 1925, William duPont, Jr. began to assemble a mass of land on the Marvland-Pennsylvania border that would eventually encompass more than 7,600 acres, to serve as a nature preserve and venue for his two favorite past times: horseracing and foxhunting. He designed a spectacular steeplechase course, recognizing the thick, healthy turf and giving it years to grow before putting it to use in 1934. Mr. duPont also built bridges, tunnels and a 17-mile "super fence" to ensure his hounds' safety during foxhunting. After duPont's death in 1965, the state of Maryland purchased their 5,633- acre portion of the estate, and created the Fair Hill Natural Resources Management Area.

In 1989, Elkins "Elkie" Wetherill and John Ryan, organizers of the Chesterland Three-Day-Event in Unionville, PA, were looking for a new site for their threestar competition, as the level was known then. They were directed to Fair Hill and enlisted the aid of Trish Gilbert.

When they saw the property, they knew the rolling terrain and lush turf made it an ideal venue for Eventing. A Founders Committee was formed, consisting of Trish Gilbert, Denis Glaccum, Kate Jackson, Jim Ligon, Bodgie Read, John Ryan, Col. D. W. Thackeray, Judy Thayer, Dick Thompson, Elkins Wetherill and Lana Wright. They also secured the services of England's Michael Tucker to design the cross-country course. The first event was held in 1989 and the initial CCI3* competition was won by Karen (Lende) O'Connor on Nos Ecus. The venue was an instant success. Tucker continued as course designer until 1999 when he passed the reins to Derek di Grazia, a former competitor and then an up-and-coming course designer. Di Grazia has since gone on to become one of the world's most respected course designer, as evidenced by his being selected as course designer for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.

In 2003 when the Dominican Republic, lacking a cross country course, was unable to host eventing, Fair Hill International hosted the Pan American Eventing Championships. In 2011, the Young Event Horse East Coast Championships for 4/5- year-olds was held at Fair Hill, and that event has remained here ever since. In 2013, the Future Event Horse East Coast Championships for 1/2/3-year-olds were held on the Fair Hill grounds with great success.



But it's among the horses and riders that Fair Hill has earned its welldeserved reputation as a cradle of champions. It has always attracted the best of the best. Riders come here to test themselves and their horses to see if they have the talent and courage to succeed at the upper levels. Several winners of the now-CCI4*-L competition at Fair Hill have gone on to achieve glory for themselves and their country at the Olympics, including David and Karen O'Connor, Phillip Dutton and Bruce Davidson.

IN MEMORIAM: JOHN RYAN * * *

n 1988, John Ryan was the Executive Director of the Chesterland Horse Trials that was coming to an end. John, along with a small group of others, began looking for the location of a suitable replacement. Their search led them to the naturally rolling terrain of Fair Hill. And, in October of 1989, the first Fair Hill International Three Day Event was run.

John had studied architecture at the University of Pennsylvania, which came in very handy for his work on course and festival layouts. John was a rider, held a TD license and was Area II Chairman for USCTA (now USEA). He had served on the committees for Radnor and Chesterland, and was a long-time FHI Board Member.

At Fair Hill, John was on the grounds nearly every day. He was more of a "Behind the Scenes" kind of guy to the competitors and spectators. But, he was behind every scene. John was heavily involved in everything to do with the cross country courses... maintenance, painting, decorating, galloping lanes the list goes on. He was in charge of tent placement, ice, water, dumpsters, restrooms - the list goes on. He was in charge of picking up XC score sheets at Horse Trials, spotting at schoolings, creating course maps - the list goes on.

In 2016, John was named the FHI Volunteer of the Year, a very well-deserved award that seems a bit like an understatement. John is missed everyday at Fair Hill. We miss his knowledge. We miss his stories. We miss his steady presence.



IN MEMORIAM: BODGIE REED

During the early years of Fair Hill International, Bodgie Reed was asked to help set up dressage, and that would begin her long relationship with FHI. She would go on to become the Dressage Coordinator, the Volunteer Coordinator, the Vet Box Coordinator, the person who flagged the courses, the person who created signs in her garage late at night after being at Fair Hill all day, and countless other jobs.

Bodgie graduated with a BS in Biology in 1955. She had grown up riding horses in Aiken, and her father was part of a small group of people that started the United States Pony Club in 1954. Bodgie was the Regional Supervisor of the Delmarva Region of USPC for 41 years. She holds the honor of being the longest continuously serving RS in US Pony Club history.

Bodgie didn't volunteer for just FHI and USPC. Bodgie was everywhere. She was volunteering at Freedom Hills Therapeutic Riding Program, Radnor Three Day, Chesterland, Plantation Field, DVCTA, St. Augustine Pony Club, Olde Hope, and many, many other venues.

In 2015, Bodgie was named the very first FHI Volunteer of the Year. There was no contest. There was nobody else who deserved the award more. Referring to all of the friends she had made along the way, Bodgie had this to say, "All of those relationships made working those long hours at Fair Hill, in all kinds of weather, absolutely worthwhile." We couldn't agree more. Bodgie, your FHI Family misses you dearly.



Eventing?

venting (which has previously been known as three-day eventing or combined training) is a three-phase competition that tests a horse's all-around ability as well as the rider's strategy, judgment and skill. It is the ultimate test of teamwork between horse and rider.

The three phases of Dressage, Cross Country and Jumping form an equestrian triathlon patterned after the skills of military horses in cavalry days: precision, elegance and obedience; jumping ability, speed, courage and versatility; and finally, the horses' ability to recover from a physical challenge and remain in service.

Dressage takes place first to show balance, obedience, flexibility, and harmony between horse and rider. Next is Cross Country, the most demanding and challenging phase, testing boldness, speed and endurance. Finally, horses must demonstrate conditioning, resilience and agility in the culminating Jumping phase. The overall winners are determined by converting Dressage scores to penalties and adding the penalties incurred in Cross Country and Jumping. The competitor with the fewest penalties wins.

There are five levels of competition in eventing. Levels are designated by stars — one-star through five-star, with five-star having the highest degree of difficulty. Horses and riders must earn the right to compete at these levels. At each successive level, a horse has to jump higher, run farther and faster, as well as trust its rider more. The degree of difficulty for gymnastic exercises — both on the flat in the Dressage phase and over fences during the Cross-Country and Jumping tests — increases progressively.

Dressage

The objective of the Dressage test is to demonstrate harmonious development of the horse's physique and balance. Each horse-and-rider combination is required to perform a prescribed set of movements within a confined area. Three independent judges award marks for each movement, ranging from 0 to 10. There are also collective marks for the horse's pace, impulsion and submission to its rider's direction, as well as for the rider's position and use of aids. The test must be executed from memory. Errors or incorrect sequences of movements are penalized by subtracting points.

Throughout the Dressage test, the judges are looking for calmness and relaxation, combined with impulsion and rhythm, all from a horse that should be at a peak of fitness and full of energy for the strenuous demands of the competition still to come. A Dressage performance should be fluid, balanced and accurate, providing an overall picture of grace and harmony.

Cross-Country

Cross-Country is a test of jumping ability, speed and endurance and is the most exciting and challenging part of competition. It is set in varied terrain, which must be jumped boldly and with speed. The jumping obstacles test a variety of skills and some may include four or five separate jumping efforts.

Competitors must complete the phase within a prescribed "optimum time" and time penalties are incurred for exceeding this time. Penalties are incurred for jumping faults, such as refusals and run-outs. Under adverse conditions of weather or terrain, phase length and time allowed may be altered for safety reasons.

This week's 5 Star course features 44 jumping efforts set over 6,330 meters, just under four miles. The 3 Star course features 34 jumping efforts set over 4,658 meters, just under three miles.

Jumping

The final phase is Jumping. Horses must pass a veterinary inspection after their great efforts of the previous day before moving on to Jumping. This inspection is similar to the inspection they passed before being allowed to begin the competition. A Jumping course consists of varied colored, moveable obstacles with penalties assessed for knockdowns, refusals, falls or exceeding the time allowed.

This week's 5 Star Jumping course includes a maximum of 13 obstacles requiring a maximum of 16 jumping efforts. The 3 Star Jumping course has a maximum of 11 obstacles requiring a maximum of 14 jumping efforts. Both are set over a distance of no more than 600 meters.



What's the Big Deal About a 5 Star?

Besides \$300,000 in prize money? A 5 Star event (CCI5*-L) is the pinnacle of the sport of eventing. It consists of the most advanced form of competition as it pertains to the skill level executed in the field of dressage, as well as tougher terrain and obstacles in both cross-country and stadium jumping. There are only seven CCI5* events in the world, with two being in the United States (Kentucky and Maryland).

The CCI5* event takes place over four days. The first two days of competition taking place on Thursday and Friday will feature dressage tests completed in the main arena. The third day of competition on Saturday is the crosscountry test, where riders jump up to 45 obstacles over almost four miles of varying terrain. The final day of competition on Sunday is show jumping, where riders jump over fragile obstacles in the main arena.



Four of the other CCI5* competitions in the world are set in Europe, the hub of the sport, and the advent of a new competition at this level in the US offers more opportunities for developing horses and riders to gain valuable education at the top level, while providing our elite athletes with a chance to hone their skills and be competitive on the world stage at Olympics and World Championships. This week, a top-class field will battle to become the first-ever Maryland 5 Star champion – and even more excitingly, we might just get to see our first US CCI5* winner since Phillip Dutton won Kentucky in 2008.

If Carlevo was a person, he might be the kind of chap who wears airy harem trousers and has to pay for extra pages in his passport. That's how well-travelled this experienced gelding is (though as Buck describes it, his vibe is a bit more 'highflying CEO with a heart of gold'). His career began in Germany with Dirk Schrade, and since joining Buck's string in 2015, he's competed at the likes of Boekelo CCIO4*-L in the Netherlands. Blenheim Palance in the UK, Tattersalls and Millstreet in Ireland, and Aachen in Germany. He's also headed north of the border, with a fourthplace finish at Canada's Bromont CCI4*-L in 2019 - but surprisingly, for all that jetsetting, this will only be his third CCI5*. He completed Kentucky in 2018 and again this spring, finishing in the top twenty both times. As the very last horse out of the box, and in the worst of the weather this year, he produced rather a slower round than we'd expect - so expect him to deliver his best-ever performance here. After all, he has venue form: he was fourth in the CCI4*-L back in 2017.



Carlevo has jumped clear for a toptwenty finish in both previous outings at five-star, so this duo will be feeling confident as they head to a venue where they've previously done well at CCI4*-L level. You can expect them to put up a fight in the first phase, as their scores inch ever-closer to the mid-20s, and they should be classy and reliable across the country, though not among the fastest. It all hinges on the showjumping for this pair: they're just as likely to go clear as they are to take two or three rails.

After competing up through the former CCI2* level with Canada's Peter Barry, Long Island T (or "Ludwig" as he's known around the barn) was acquired by Boyd Martin through the Long Island T Syndicate after the 2016 season. Boyd took some time to acquaint himself with the big, strong German-bred gelding and eventually brought him to Kentucky this past April for his CCI5* debut. It wasn't meant to be, however, as the two parted ways coming out of the Head of the Lake complex in Kentucky.


Since then, Boyd has worked to get Ludwig's confidence back up to brimming. He rebounded nicely at Jersey Fresh following Kentucky, finishing 10th in the CCI4*-L there, but also encountered some trouble on course at the USEA American Eventing Championships over the summer. For his final prep run, Boyd stepped the gelding down to the Preliminary level, where he won his division on an impressive score of 15.9.

We know that this horse has talent and potential spades, but the question mark still remains as to whether or not Long Island T will prove his mettle as a five-star horse this weekend. If he does, expect him to put up a very competitive performance.





Ludwig has two excellent phases and one that remains a bit of a wild card, but his hugely experienced rider has put a lot of time, effort, and patience into producing the German gelding and this could be his week to shine. Expect him to put up a fight in the first phase and feature among the best of the US contingent, and on Sunday, you can look forward to a likely clear round, too. 

It'll be a sophomore appearance at the five-star level for Will Coleman's incredibly tall DonDante, who debuted at Kentucky in the spring but finished his week early when he hung a leg at the Head of the Lake, giving Will a free diving lesson in the process.

But as frustrating as an unplanned dunking is, it's also an educational moment – and Will will certainly have spent the months since Kentucky solidifying his form, which he's proved with a classy clear at the CCI3*-S at Great Meadow since. While it's not quite DonDante's time to fight for the win, expect him to deliver three solid performances and make the most of the course: after all, he finished 12th in his first-ever CCI4*-L here back in 2019, and he's easily one of the best showjumpers in the field with just one international rail to his name in fifteen FEI starts.

Oh, and his name? It comes from a song by My Morning Jacket – one of Will's favorite bands.

Pfun – so named because he's so fun to ride, and we don't recommend Googling any other alternative meanings – brings charisma, consistency, and experience into his third career CCI5* run. We last saw him finish in the top twenty at this level when completing Kentucky in 2019, and though he's had some time out with injury, he's been laying down solid performances like clockwork over the last two seasons. We'll be looking for him to better his dressage average, because his scores are getting lower each time out, and he's very reliable in both jumping phases, so can climb.

A full brother to her first CCI5* horse, Snooze Alarm, Vermiculus comes forward for his seventh start at the level. Vermiculus, whose name translates to "worm" in Latin in allusion to his brother, nicknamed "Maggot", has become one of Lauren's most prolific partners, partnering with her for the 2018 WEG as well as Aachen last month.


Lauren and Vermiculus earned a top-20 finish at Kentucky in April, but they've finished in the top 10 in three other CCI5* events, including a fifth place in the horse's debut at the level in 2018. While a fall near the end of the 2018 WEG track cost them a championship finish, this pair is quite capable of achieving a competitive result in Maryland. Lauren would classify their performance in Aachen last month as a bit of a disappointment — she knows what this horse is capable of, and what she is capable of bringing out in him — but she'll be setting out with a firm game plan this week.

Well-known around the barn as quite the cheeky guy, "Bug" has a larger-than-life personality. Lauren, who is widely respected for her thoughtful production of horses from the early days of their careers, has had to work through some quirks with the gelding through the years. But some tweaks have helped this pair shine their brightest, and this just could be a weekend where all that attention to detail pays off in spades.



BY THE NUMBERS

A 35.6 on their last outing at Aachen drives Vermiculus's first-phase average up, but we'll actually be looking for a sub-30 score from his fan-favorite gelding. He'll be right up there going into cross-country day, where we can expect him to be reliable and confident, and though he's not naturally as fast as some of the horses in the field, Lauren is super experienced and will seek out economcial lines to shave off the seconds. They're likely to have a pole on Sunday but if they don't, we should see a top ten finish this week. **CROSS-COUNTRY PERFORMANCE**








'Socs' didn't have much success on the track, and actually retired from racing after just two starts, despite costing a whopping \$170,000 as a yearling. But he'd been in training with Graham Motion, who had also trained Icabad Crane, and so the trainer – and owner Sheikh Fahad al-Thani – decided to give the system another go.

Socs proved a prodigy in his new career, winning his first-ever event, and since stepping up to the upper levels, he's picked up innumberable top-ten placings, including third in the Morven Park CCI4*-S in 2019, tenth in the Great Meadow CCI4*-S in 2020, and fifth at Jersey Fresh CCI4*-L this May. He's naturally very quick and bold, and though this is a major step up, he'll be prepared to fight for the top Thoroughbred title.







FE Stormtrooper made his CCI5* debut at Kentucky this spring, but a fall on cross-country eliminated the pair from competition. Clayton spent the rest of the season aiming for Maryland, and most recently the pair finished seventh in the CCI4*-S at Stable View in September.

Clayton describes FE Stormtrooper as an interesting type of character: a bit on the nervous side, but he's begun to really come into his own over the recent months. Confidence has been the key as they continue their march toward Maryland, and Clayton has been pleased with the gelding's ramping up for round two at the five-star level.

Clayton and his wife, Lisa, run a busy operation with importing horses, operating Fredericks Equestrian International temporary stabling, designing cross country courses, and raising their son, Hunter. Despite the omnipresent hustle, Clayton's managed to produce a handful of horses up to the five-star level, and he's ready to give a masterclass this weekend.



This weekend will be the CCI5* debut for RF Cool Play, who was purchased by the Donner Syndicate in 2016 as a rising star for Lynn Symansky. It would prove to be a shrewd addition, as "Coolio" went on to partner with Lynn as a part of the gold medal winning U.S. team at the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru. Lynn and Coolio were also individual silver medalists in Lima.

RF Cool Play has been a consistent performer for Lynn with competitive dressage abilities and barely a mark on his cross country jumping record throughout his career. The 13-year-old gelding finished 11th in his last CCI4*-L at Tryon just under a year ago. Experience and education in this first go will be the keys to the game for Lynn and this horse -- but she's still a competitive, gutsy rider who knows how to get the job done. She won't be one to leave a competitive finish on the table if it's within her reach.

Coolio is known around for barn for his big, in-yourpocket personality, and Lynn likes to joke that he's actually a German Riding Pony (spoiler: he's 17.1) when asked about his breeding.







This is the first time former Pau winner and Olympic gold and silver medalist Astier has crossed the pond for a five-star, and he does so with an exceptionally exciting young horse. 



Don't forget to give them an "allez, allez!" as they gallop by, to help them feel at home!

But what we can expect is a solid score in the very low 30s, which he'll do his best to stay on – of course, nothing can be guaranteed at this level, especially for a first-timer, but this is one of the fastest, most consistent cross-country horses in the field; he hasn't had an FEI time penalty since 2019, and he's consistent over poles, too, which should help him climb.



Pony Club alum Meghan grew up as a member of the O'Donoghue family-run Le Cheval de Boskydell and Boskydell Pony Club. She now runs a busy coaching, sales and training business in Round Hill, Virginia.

Meghan brought Palm Crescent to Kentucky in April of this year, where he finished 23rd in his debut at the CCI5* level.






Bogue Sound, the Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred originally snapped off the track by Dorothy Crowell, was born to do cross-country. The chestnut gelding, who won a little over \$11,000 through seven racing starts, became Jessie's ride for owner Amara Hoeppner in 2016 after he'd done some Preliminary events. Now 14, 'Bogie' is preparing for his second CCI5*, having finished in the top 15 in his debut at Kentucky in 2019. He also finished eighth in the Lexington CCI4*-S earlier this year.


Olympian Jessie, who bases in Ontario for most of the year, is a bit of a superwoman herself. She's made several successful returns to competition after sustaining many a serious injury, two maternity leaves, and the multiple other highs and lows that can be found dotting any event rider's career timeline.

Now, Bogue Sound looks set to step up to Jessie's top string as she looks ahead to the World Equestrian Games in 2022. Look for her to seek a competitive finish here, maybe even improving on Bogie's top-15 in his first five-star. He's yet to pick up a jumping penalty in 21 international attempts with Jessie in the irons. And while he, like most Thoroughbreds, tends not to love the first phase of competition, his scores have trended towards more competitive as he's gotten stronger and more experienced.

Bogie's a trusting, laid-back guy who still has a good sense of humor. If he were to have a celebrity doppleganger, she told Horse Sport last year, it would likely be country singer Blake Shelton. No word yet on whether or not he can carry a tune.




Jennie and her special mare 'Toddie' are hoping that the third time will be the charm after two frustrating early finishes to their other CCI5* starts this year, which took place at Kentucky in the spring and at June's Luhmühlen Horse Trials in Germany.

It was through Steve, whom Emma was instructing at the time, that Frisky came to be her first upper-level partner – but it wouldn't be without some proper time put in.

After the injury Steve brought the gelding home to start his rehab and figure out the next steps. It was at this point that Emma made it her goal to put the big, rangy horse back together. She patiently worked with Frisky, going for long walks and diligently tending to his care. Soon, the scans began to look more promising than veterinarians had originally hoped. At first, Steve tried Frisky out as his personal dressage horse, but it was a short-lived arrangement after he declared that he could not ride the enormous trot Frisky possessed. And so, his partnership with Emma began to take on life in the saddle.



They've competed at this fall championship here at Fair Hill in the past, finishing 12th in the then-CCI3* in 2018.


When Karl isn't on a horse (or even when he is!), he can often be found listening to his favorite band, Nickelback - a choice we'll merrily mock him for forever.



Ashlynn Meucheul knows how to be a road warrior. After growing up in Kalispell, Montana (home of The Event at



Two-time Canadian Olympian Hawley has had some special horses in her life, and the 17-year-old Jollybo has certainly stepped into her predecessors' shoes with class and just a little bit of sass. This weekend will be the sixth CCI5* start together for this pair, who first joined up in 2016 after the little mare was sourced by Great Britain's Kate Tarrant and produced in the U.S. through the the CCI4*-L level by fellow Brit Justine Dutton. Hawley would likely tell you her preference is a cheeky bay mare – if you hearken back to the Gin & Juice days, you might see a few commonalities.

This is a pair that's been working hard at home to hone their craft, and Hawley can often be found bringing riders such as her longtime coach Buck Davidson out to her home base in southern California for regular clinics. Her hard work has paid off, as Jollybo's dressage scores have trended downward since their partnership began.

After rerouting to Jersey Fresh this spring after a minor foot issue kept Jollybo off the cross-country at Kentucky out of an abundance of caution, Hawley and "Jolly" finished 14th in the CCI4*-L and also picked up a top-five finish in the CCI4*-L at Rebecca Farm this summer. Though the mare is in the latter stages of her career, we wouldn't rule them out for the WEG next year – so expect them to go for it here.





"Larger than life" is how British Olympic gold medalist Leslie Law would describe the flashy Voltaire de Tre, who at the age of just 10 made a smashing CCI5* debut at Kentucky 2019 to finish in the top 10 overall. 'Splash', who is owned by and named after Tre Book, will now make his third start at the level, having also done Kentucky earlier this year. With looks to match his 'splashy' personality, the French-bred gelding is impossible to miss, but sometimes this part of his personality can make him a bit of a handful to ride. Generally speaking, though, Leslie calls Splash a "trier" who does want to do his best work, even when it's hard to contain his enthusiasm for the task at hand.

Leslie is a big believer in a proper system for producing horses and has a penchant for slow, proper training that yields long-lasting results. The ongoing pipeline is not easy to establish or maintain, but you can always count on Leslie to have a proper stable of rising stars and tactfully produced veterans on his roster at any given time.

Based in Ocala, Florida with his wife, Lesley, and their son, Liam, Leslie also does plenty of coaching as the USEF Eventing Development and Emerging Athletes Coach. He can typically be found helping the next generation of star event riders hone their skills, complementing the practical curriculum with other well-rounded teachings to produce not only competant riders, but excellent horsemen and women.







Flying the flag for French breeding in the US is the striking Splash, who's been an excellent partner to gold medallist Leslie back out at the top level. Oliver Townend's two-time Kentucky winner is an interesting horse, and not just because of those victories. His competition record over the last few years is noticably sparse compared to most of the other horses in the field, and Oliver rarely runs him in shortformat internationals. Instead, he'll tactically enter him at Open Intermediates, withdrawing if the ground is suboptimal or the horse doesn't need the run, which can sometimes mean that the horse only actually goes cross-country a couple of times a year. But this is a system that has been honed over a number of seasons, and the proof is in the pudding: before both of his previous wins at Kentucky, he ran two Intermediates at a slow, steady pace.


'Coolio' lives in the equine equivalent of Millionaire's Row, the optimal block of stables that can be seen from Oliver's house on his Shropshire farm. That means that the sight of his two favorite horses, Coolio and this year's Kentucky winner, Ballaghmor Class, bookends his days – and that's just how he likes it. Though he tends not to be a soppy type outwardly, Oliver is enormously fond of his horses, and particularly of these two, who have given him and his team such an extraordinary amount of joy.

Consider this the biggest hurdle standing in the way of a first US CCI5* winner since 2008 – though the quality in this field means Oliver will have his work cut out for him.








While some horses opt for a conventional path to superstardom, Jak My Style - who's named after a song by the band fun., making this a particularly musical field - has chosen a route more familiar to those who grew up on the culture of movies like 'Sylvester'. He began his career intended for the track, but never raced because he kept putting his exercise riders on the floor. After the death of his owner and trainer, he was sold as part of an estate sale and picked up by a family who hoped he might make a nice hunter for their daughter. He was a bit too sparkly for that life, too, and was sold on to event rider Matthew Bryner, who sat enough of his bucks to produce him to Advanced before now-owner Kat Cuca bought him for US-based Brit Justine Dutton. After two years together, the horse joined Buck's string, and now comes to Maryland for his fourth CCI5* start after logging his first completion at Kentucky this spring, where he finished 29th. Since then, we've seen him finish fourth in the Advanced Championship at the AECs - and ninth in the Beginner Novice at Essex with Kat aboard.



'Hugo' is a spooky talent – we've spotted Tim nearly eating dirt on numerous occasions after Hugo has completed a dressage test and then nearly fainted of stage fright upon exiting the arena. But he knows when to put his head down and focus on getting his homework done, and as a result, he's responsible for rather a lot of exciting placings through his career, including a third-place finish at Badminton in 2017 – Tim's best result at the event. He was third at Kentucky in 2019 and second this spring, too, as well as thirteenth at Pau last year – though he does have the odd blip under his belt too, and was retired at Burghley in 2019 after picking up a 20.


Tim's had the ride on Hugo since 2014, taking the reins from Canada's Rebecca Howard, who produced him to CCI4*-S and had taken over from Ireland's Esib Power, who brought the horse to CCI3*-L and a top-ten finish in the British Seven-Year-Old Championships. In 2015, he finished tenth in Blenheim's prestigious eight- and nine-yearold CCI4*-S, generally a reliable indicator of an illustrious top-level career to come.

He's certainly proven that point in the years since, and should earn Tim another great result here. If his US trajectory continues as it has done so far, that great result could even be a win.

He might not be a conventional superstar - in fact, Tim would probably tell you the gelding's a bit of a weirdo, really - but Hugo knows how to step up when it counts, and we tend to see him knuckle down and focus the most in a big CCI5* atmosphere. That means we should see another high-20s mark, and he ought to be very quick, too, as long as he keeps his brain on the job at hand. 

Lillian's own horse had been sidelined, so she needed to find a replacement – and so, with trainer Boyd Martin's advice to just choose one that jumps well in her mind, she picked the rank, rogue gelding that no one enjoyed riding, because he never, ever said no to a fence. They began their career together in Britain, and since then, they've become familiar faces at the top events all over the world.

And with that Burghley behind them? There's no telling what they could do here.






It's a CCI5* debut for Candy King, who will be piloted by Canadian rider Holly Jacks-Smither. 'Mini-Me' has flown a bit under the radar while he's come up the levels, and most reading this will recognize Holly's recently-retired five-star partner, More Inspiration, as the horse she's been seen inhaling big tracks with. But don't count this rising star out as a debutant – he's got nearly three full seasons at the Advanced level under his girth now, and he's been produced tactfully by Holly, who's based in Canada with her husband, racehorse trainer Bruce Smither.

Holly and Candy King were named as Canadian alternates for the 2019 Pan American Games in Peru, and while their services weren't needed it was a nod to the budding talent in Holly's string. After More Inspiration was unexpectedly retired earlier this year, it was Candy King's turn to step up into his stablemate's shoes. And he's done just that, finishing no worse than twelfth in each of his starts this year, save one blip in the form of a rider fall at Millbrook.

The goal for this weekend will be experience, building for the future. Canada has a strong contingent of upand-coming horses and seasoned riders in its ranks, so it's an exciting time to have a horse getting confirmed at the top levels. After all, the World Equestrian Games are rapidly approaching already, so keep an eye on Candy King, who's en route to becoming a championship horse in his own right.



Throughout their partnership, the two have overcome multiple obstacles – like stall rest for a year and a half because of a pasture accident – to get to where they are today. 
"She's so unspecial that she's incredibly special," says Jonelle. "There's nothing fantastic; she's quite an ordinary mover, a bit of an unorthodox jumper, but she's got a ginormous heart. She's got a huge will to be an event horse and she's fierce and courageous." Her Badminton victory in 2018 - Jonelle's first win at the level - felt like a fairytale come true: we'd all watched Jonelle and Molly battle it out and come so close for years, and it felt thoroughly well- earned, but it also aged everyone by about ten years to watch them pick their way around the showjumping course, tippy-tapping each pole and bouncing it in its cups. That they all stayed up seemed a miracle, whether you'd been watching all the near-misses yourself or whether you'd clocked that their previous clear showjumping round in an international had been a whopping four years prior. Some things just feel like kismet, and that was one of them - though there was an awful lot of hard work that went into making it happen.


Islandwood Captain Jack would be the most experienced and well-traveled of the Martin horses this weekend, and he's the only top-level horse that she has held onto as some of her former rides were moved to different homes to allow her to focus on her sales program. This weekend marks the third CCI5* start for Caroline and "James", who finished 35th at Kentucky in April. They also traveled to The Event at Rebecca Farm over the summer, where they finished second in the CCI4*-L.



BY THE NUMBERS

Islandwood Captain Jack is really starting to figure out his job at the upper levels of the sport this season: after jumping clear around his second CCI5*, he delivered a clear inside the time for second place in the Rebecca Farm CCI4*-L. His dressage is continually improving, and we could see him better his 35.8 at Kentucky this spring, and while he's not naturally super fast, he's ready for a five-star run with the handbrake off. 


If you're a fan of a comeback tale, Harry Meade is the rider you'll want to make sure you catch this week. He's one of Britain's biggest stars, and comes from an extraordinary eventing dynasty - his father is the late Richard Meade, who was a hugely formative part of Britain's golden era. But along the way, Harry has dealt with some major hurdles: most recently, he suffered a horrific freak accident at the British Young Horse Championships at Thoresby in October of last year. A fall early in the course quickly turned into every rider's worst nightmare when his foot got caught in the stirrup and he was dragged at a gallop, sustaining repeated kicks to the head that eventually knocked his hat off. In the months since, he's undergone multiple surgeries on his elbow - both of which were badly broken in a previous accident some years ago - and extensive rehab to rebuild strength and regain his balance and vision, which were affected by trauma to his brain's vestibular system. It's been a joy to see him and his wife, Rosie, back out on the circuit, where they always have a smile and a kind word to share.


Harry and Superstition made the journey over for Kentucky this spring, where they absolutely excelled themselves: they finished fifth after delivering arguably the round of the day on Saturday, romping home clear inside the time in tough conditions. They'll be aiming for the same or better this week.



BY THE NUMBERS

After a fifth place finish at Kentucky earlier this year, Harry returns to the US with top horse Superstition with an aim to go a few places higher. His sub-30 score there was one of the best they've achieved in their relatively short partnership, but it's certainly achievable again here, as is another clear inside the time. The only thing that could stand in their way as they climb the leaderboard is the final phase: they're prone to a pole, and the top spots will be tightly packed come Sunday. If they can deliver a clear, this pair could be fighting for Harry's first win at this level.


Indy 500 wouldn't necessarily be a horse you'd pick out of the line-up as an obvious champion, but by this stage in her career, this warhorse mare has proven she's a force to be reckoned with. With 36 FEI completions spanning a decade-long partnership, this West Coast duo aren't here to play.

'Indy' actually came to Andrea's program at Twin Rivers Ranch, which hosts several events including a CCI4*-L, a bit by accident. Andrea had originally passed on the mare as a twoyear-old, but then found herself taking in a thenfour-year-old Indy for training to be eventually sold. Andrea describes her as similar to Queen Elizabeth, descending from her carriage to cast an intelligently haughty eye over her kingdom, the first time the mare stepped off the trailer. It was as if she'd decided to stay.

Andrea also bred and competes Laguna Seca, who is Indy 500's now-11-year-old son by the Holsteiner Linaro. In fact, "baby T-rex" (aptly named for some of the youthful antics he'd play growing up – and his towering size) recently stepped up to the Advanced level himself. Though Andrea says Indy was "a terrible mother", she's that much more grateful to have produced what is likely her only descendent.





On Cue joined Boyd Martin's string before competing in any FEI-level events, having formerly been produced through the Preliminary level by fellow five-star rider Sinead Halpin. Now this stunning, bright bay mare has proven her guns at the top of the sport, even earning herself a nod as a traveling alternate horse for Boyd and his Tokyo Olympic mount, Tsetserleg TSF. On Cue traveled to the team's pre-export quarantine at Aachen in Germany to be on call in case her number was called and though she ultimately did not make the trip to Tokyo, she certainly benefited from some of the experience gained in the lead-up training camp.


After a smashing debut at the CCI5* level in Kentucky this spring, where she finished fourth overall and was crowned the USEF CCI5* Eventing National Champion, On Cue went on to win the \$60,000 Adequan USEA Advanced Final in August and also finished in the top 10 at her final prep run in Unionville. In short, this mare has been the picture of consistency as she has continued to move up the levels, even surprising Boyd himself a bit with her stalwart performance at Kentucky.

This pair could be a serious contender for the top of the board in Maryland this weekend. If On Cue can equal or improve on her performance from her CCI5* debut, she'll no doubt be a part of that victory gallop come Sunday. Though she'll probably slot in behind stablemate Long Island T after the first phase, she's ultra-reliable on crosscountry and quick, too. Much will hinge on the final phase – they're prone to a rail, which will be expensive in this company, but if they leave the poles in the cups they stand a serious chance.

Though his first career as a steeplechaser in France didn't quite work out, 'Phish' – another of Will's horses to be named in honour of one of his favorite bands – has become one of US eventing's best competitors in his new life.


This will be a sixth CCI5* appearance for the gelding, who finished 13th and best of the Thoroughbreds at Kentucky in 2021 and 2019 and has jumped around Burghley, too. Although he's got a couple of unfortunate little dings on his record – such as THAT flag penalty at Kentucky in 2019 and jumping penalties at both Burghley and the Tryon WEG – he's ordinarily at his very best at this level, and will be one of the horses we look to as a barometer of whether the optimum time is achievable. It's this skill that will allow him to climb after his low-to-mid-30s first-phase score – and if he can stay on his dressage mark, as he did in the CCI4*-L here in 2017, where he finished second – we could really see him work some magic.







been part of Will's string since 2019, but they've wasted no time in making an impression on the US circuit. They haven't finished outside the top 15 in their last four FEI runs, which includes the gelding's CCI5* debut at Kentucky, where he finished fourteenth after adding just 4.4 cross-country time penalties and a rail to his first-phase score of 33.8. Other than one little blip in his first-ever run with Will, which was a Preliminary at Pine Top in 2019, the pair have never had a cross-country jumping penalty.

We've seen Mason out and about in fine style since he joined the five-star club, too. He finished second in the Advanced at Five Points Horse Trials in August, despite a steady cross-country time, which was likely planned by savvy, sympathetic producer Will. We'll be expecting another very exciting performance here, though his token four faults over the poles could prove expensive.



His mid-30s scores will stop him fighting for the win this year, but he should get himself another clear crosscountry trip with minimal time, which will see him climb and could put him in hunting distance of the top ten. 


"Patrick" made his eventing debut with Hannah Sue Burnett before transferring to Lauren's program in 2011. At the time, he'd progressed through the Novice level. In the intervening years, Lauren has put her stamp on the gelding, tactfully moving him through the levels before finding herself up against a roadblock in the show jumping phase as he got to the upper levels. After Landmark's Monte Carlo began accumulating a higher number of rails in the show jumping than was characteristic, Lauren wanted to find something to give the gelding an injection of confidence. That's when Cathy Wieschoff recommended she try bringing in an animal communicator. Believe it or not, the tips provided by the animal communicator – which centered around positive encouragement and taking the pressure off - helped Lauren turn a corner. He may still have a pole down here and there, but the nerves seem to have been soothed.



BY THE NUMBERS

This will be a fourth CCI5* start for the striking grey gelding, who has twice been a top twenty finisher at Kentucky. He's got masses of experience and a penchant for going fast and clear across the country – and he's jumped well at this venue before, finishing twelfth in the CCI4*-L back in 2016. Expect a low-30s dressage, and likely a quick round on Saturday – though he hasn't run a long-format event since 2019, he added nothing across the country on that occasion.


It's been all too easy to overlook the exceptional Fernhill Singapore, purely because Phillip's Tokyo Olympics mount, Z, is such a spotlight-stealer. But even before he made his CCI5* debut at Kentucky this spring, Singer was producing some seriously exciting results: he's won the CCI3*-S here last year, and finished fifth in the CCI4*-L in 2019.

Along the way, he's earned himself a reputation for being reliable and quick across the country – and for being one of the best showjumpers in the field, too. We've only seen him pull one rail in an FEI competition since 2017 (that's 17 clears from 18 international rounds!), and he jumped clear in both phases at Kentucky, too, finishing 27th after adding 15.6 time penalties to his dressage score of 35. Now, though, he's prepared for his second time at the level by winning the CCI4*-S at Great Meadows, where he added just 3.2 time to his impressive 27.6 dressage. On this form, he's a dark horse contender to fight for the first US five-star win since Phillip won Kentucky back in 2008.



Coming into a five-star off the back of two FEI wins in a row isn't a shabby position to find yourself in, and Fernhill Singapore will fight to continue that excellent form this week. His dressage average doesn't reflect the fact that his most recent scores have been in the 20s – 23.8 at Stable View, to be precise – so we could see him frighten the dressage leaders this week. He produced a steady clear at Kentucky this spring, but once the handbrake's released, he's capable of competitive speed – and over poles, he's in a league of his own.

Buck – who's the son of eventing legend Bruce Davidson – is a busy man this week, but that's the way he likes it: he hasn't brought fewer than two rides to that other US CCI5* in any year since 2013. Now, at the first-ever Maryland Five-Star, he's the best-stocked rider in the field, with three horses on his roster.

Erroll Gobey, who was bred in Germany but initially produced in the UK by JP Sheffield, is the youngest and least experienced of the three. He made his five-star debut at Kentucky this spring, though was retired on course after going green at the first water. Since then, Buck's been busy putting the wheels back on the bus, and Gobey has stepped up, finishing sixth and second in Advanced classes at the Horse Park of New Jersey and Millbrook Horse Trials, respectively. Considering that his Kentucky run came after a retirement in the Open Intermediate at Chattahoochee Hills after activating a safety device, he should be feeling confident and ready to rumble on his second attempt at the level.



This is still a relatively inexperienced horse, and his primary focus will be nailing down a first five-star completion after retiring at Kentucky on his debut earlier this year. They've had just one FEI cross-country run since then, but it's been a very, very good one: they finished second in the CCI4*-S at Unionville, adding just 0.8 time penalties along the way. This could be set to be the season in which Erroll Gobey steps up from a boy to a man, and this week will be a crucial stepping stone for his exciting future.
